



PASTOR'S CORNER

Connecting Like Jesus

The Ontario Conference has designated 2022 as "The Year of Multiplication". The ministry direction of 2021-2022 is **Connecting Like Jesus** in ministry and mission through discipleship. All churches are encouraged to create their own ministry strategy (values, vision and action plans) to align with this. We made our church ministry strategy at the end of 2021 and are ready to move with a full-fledged push. Our vision is to become a church of loving and forgiving ambassadors of God. We hope to inspire at least 30% of our members to become ambassadors by the end of 2022. God has given each of His children "the ministry of reconciliation" and assigned them to be "ambassadors" for Him before He returns (2Cor. 5:18-20).

Why do we need to become ambassadors for Christ? It is God's commission for all of us. In the process of becoming ambassadors, we, as a church, strive to reach people in the Greater Toronto Area and around the world



with the distinctive, Christ-centered Adventist message of hope and wholeness. We are citizens of God's kingdom. Every citizen must seek first the kingdom of God (Matt. 6:33), speak on behalf of the kingdom (Eph. 4:12), train others (Eph. 4:13), lead and share what is good from the kingdom (Acts 1:8) and continue to encourage others in love and forgiveness (1Thess. 5:11; Heb. 3:13, 10:24-25).

How are we going to achieve this vision? First, after the 25 th church anniversary, we adopted the values of the NAD REACH initiative: Revival & transformation (Connecting with God through public and personal worship); Education for discipleship (Every youth and adult learning, growing and becoming more like Christ); Alignment within the church (Connecting effectively within our diverse church family); Community outreach & evangelism (Connecting with our communities—sharing hope and wholeness); Healthy leadership & management (God's stewards insisting on personal and church-wide excellence).



Second, early this year, the church aligned all ministry departments into seven "F Team" ministries based on REACH values and Jesus' prayers in John 17. Jesus' ministry modeled 7 purposes (John 17:1-26 NIV):

- 1. Faith: Spiritual Development (Values, Purpose, Intuition, Vitality) (v.4)
- 2. Frontier: Occupational Development (Employment, Volunteering) (v.6)
- 3. Fortifier: Intellectual Development (Mind) (v.8)
- 4. **Fellowship:** Psychological and Emotional Development (Feelings) (v.12)
- 5. Friendship: Social and Relational Development (Family, Friends, Relationships) (v.18)
- Forwarder: Financial Development (Communication & Resources) (v.18)
- 7. Frontliner: Physical Development (Body) (v.18)

Currently, we continue to use the NAD MdX method to reach our three current church goals: Connect, Grow & Multiply via two types of responsibilities: church and individual members.

CONNECT (RELATIONAL DISCIPLESHIP ENVIRONMENT):

Actively involve all church members. In the first phase, at least 100 members (8 groups, young and old) of our church family will be part of CARE Groups and the EMM Network (Every member = Encourager, Mentee, Mentor) to deepen the church family relationship. EMM Network is a mentorship program based on Jesus and the three disciples Peter, John and James (Luke 9:28-30). Each church member has three functions: Encourager, Mentor and Mentee and would have three people involved in his or her spiritual life. In turn, 30 committed members will grow to become mature disciple-makers by December 25, 2022.

GROW (INTENTIONAL LEADERSHIP): Vigorously equip at least 40 active members through leadership development processes with Abundant Life Growth Track courses to become mature disciples of Christ through CARE Group ministries by December 25, 2022.

MULTIPLY (DISCIPLESHIP PROCESS): Reach the Toronto community, especially newcomers, with God's love and lead at least 20 people to become baptized Adventists by December 25, 2022.

The church's responsibility is to provide several worship services every week, such as Children's Ministry (Adventurers, children's choir, children's sabbath school classes), Youth Ministry (Pathfinders) and Young Adult Ministry (Master Guide). The church will host four CRDP events, five Growth Track courses, three Bridge events, three Marriage Bootcamp days, a Couples Retreat, etc. The members' responsibility is to attend events and courses to gain new skills and experiences to teach others. Every member is encouraged to join a CARE Group and EMM Network.

Let's continue to trust and be united in serving the Lord.
Let's join and serve in God's purpose of 2022. I am looking forward to the great things God has prepared for us this year. May God bless you all!

That's why it's important to do what we can do to be ambassadors for God 24/7. We never fully know how we can affect other people with just our words, behaviour, and actions. Even if that action is doing something as seemingly insignificant as posting a Christian meme!

Creating A Caring Church

It has been a year since my son and I got baptized–May 22, 2021 to be exact. It continues to be an enriching, inspiring, enlightening and fulfilling experience for both of us. As members of the "New Disciples for Christ" CARE Group, I am most grateful that our group is very accepting and supportive of my son. When your group accepts and supports you and is non-judgmental, you feel like you can open your heart to them and belong to a God-focused family. This deepens your understanding of how God is present in your life no matter what you're going through. It also helps that while we go through our theology classes, we also have fun together. Our CARE Group is led by Elder Andrew Runge-Skytte who is thorough in his teaching and will not leave a Bible verse or particular topic until it is fully understood by everyone.

CARE Groups model cell groups and meet a few times a week. They constitute the backbone of ministry and outreach in the local church. They are a primary expression of the church's vision to grow genuine loving relationships with each other based on God's word, and create intentional opportunities to live Jesus' call to love one another as He loves us. To fully follow this call, we must immerse ourselves in each other's lives and learn to love in genuine, practical ways that come in response to knowing others and allowing others to know us. To create a church community that really cares for one another, the best way to do it is through small groups. When small groups become the vehicle for caregiving, the whole church gets involved in sharing one another's burdens naturally - hospital visits, childcare or providing meals when someone is in crisis. This is another example of how small groups become extended family. If we live far away from our relatives, we really need that kind of connection with people.

BENEFITS OF BEING IN A CARE GROUP:

1) YOU WILL BEGIN TO FEEL LIKE A PART OF GOD'S FAMILY

Most people in a CARE group say the greatest benefit is developing close relationships. It helps knowing that others face the same difficulties, have lived through them and have learned spiritual principles in the process. In the New Testament, the phrase "one another" is used over 50 times to describe our relationship to other believers. We are instructed to love one another, bear one another's burdens and build up one another. To obey these commands is to be in "community" with one another. God never meant for you to do the Christian life alone. If you're lonely and feel disconnected or uncared for, part of the answer is to join a CARE group.

2) PRAYER WILL BECOME MORE MEANINGFUL TO YOU

Many people are hesitant to pray in front of others, especially in a large church. In a CARE group, you learn to participate in prayer by having a conversation together with God. No one is pressured to pray, but as you become comfortable, you'll be able to pray sentence

prayers. There are many promises in the Bible related to group prayer. In praying with others, we are drawn together and find answers to the needs in our lives.

3) YOU WILL BE ABLE TO HANDLE STRESS AND PRESSURE BETTER

CARE groups provide primary support in times of crisis, change and stress. You will have a sense of stability knowing there are people who care and are committed to standing with you. When someone loses a job, a family member has an illness or a mother needs a babysitter, CARE groups naturally take care of you. Many throughout the world could testify they would not have made it through difficult times if not for their support group.

4) YOU WILL HAVE A NATURAL WAY TO SHARE CHRIST WITH FRIENDS, RELATIVES AND WORK ASSOCIATES

Most of us have friends who have not crossed the line of faith with Christ or who wouldn't be caught dead in a church. Some have preconceived notions about church and Christians that just the thought makes them defensive. However, they may be open to a casual gathering and discussion in a home. In a CARE group, your unbelieving friend can ask questions and express honest doubts without feeling put on the spot. When your friend sees the love, warmth and honesty of your group, it will make them more receptive to the Good News.

5) YOU WILL USE YOUR GIFTS AND DEVELOP LEADERSHIP SKILLS YOU NEVER KNEW YOU HAD

The Bible teaches that every believer is given certain talents or gifts to help others in God's family. Unfortunately, most Christians remain as Saturday morning spectators all their lives because large group meetings are primarily sit-and-listen situations. As you share and participate in a relaxed CARE group setting, your confidence and self-esteem rises and when ready, you will be willing to step out when opportunity arises. Developing leadership skills will help you at work, church and in relationships.

6) YOU WILL DEEPEN YOUR UNDERSTANDING OF WORSHIP

Many believers mistakenly feel that worship can only happen on Saturday morning in a large group with a sermon, worship team and offering plate. Worship happens anytime we focus on God. Sometimes that happens best in smaller groups that pray and sing, serve someone in need or have a fun time together.

7) YOU WILL BE A NEW TESTAMENT CHRISTIAN

The Book of Acts is clear about how God intends His people to grow and have their needs met in church. We will never be able to have enough professional pastors to meet all the individual needs in our family. God never intended for it to be that way. Consider these verses:

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer... All the believers were together and had everything in common... Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

-Acts 2:42, 44, 46-47 (NIV)

Day after day, in the temple courts and from house to house, they never stopped teaching and proclaiming the good news that Jesus is the Messiah.


